Teach comprehension first. Skills like phonics can be developed after meaning is established or receptive and expressive vocabulary is strong. Plan comprehension-building activities before, during, and after the reading, such as picture walks (looking at and discussing the pictures in a book before reading to build background) and writing a personal response.

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
